#### **ADMISSION**

The College is co—educational.

The placing of a student as a pupil at St. Dominic's College implies a full acceptance of the Rules and Regulations of the College.

Applications for admission, on prescribed forms, will be accepted immediately after the announcement of the M.B.O.S.E. HSLC result. Each application must be accompanied by:

- i) An attested copy of the mark sheet of the examination passed.
- ii) A recent passport size photograph of the student.

#### When a student is admitted, the Admission Form must be accompanied by:

- A testimonial copy of character from the Head of the school last attended.
- ii) An attested copy of the mark sheet of the last examination passed.
- iii) Two further passport size photographs of the student.
- iv) An ORIGINAL Transfer certificate from the School last attended.

An ORIGINAL Migration certificate, for those students coming from Boards other than Meghalaya or Mizoram is to be handed over to the office not later than one month from the date of admission.

The Original Mark Sheet must be produced at the time of admission. The Original Mark Sheet is not to be handed in to the Office under any circumstances.

The College reserves the right to refuse an application for admission without assigning any reason for the same.

When admission is granted, all fees must be paid and the admission form must be deposited at the College Office within the stipulated period, otherwise the admission will stand cancelled. Application forms not accompanied by all the required documents will not be accepted.

#### **COURSES OF STUDY**

The college conducts in Arts, Science and Commerce. The duration of the Higher Secondary Course is Two Years. Examinations are conducted every year by the University. First Year students will move on the Second Year after the First Year results by the University. Those students who fail in one or more subjects in the First Year will have to clear them at the next Examination of the University along with their Second Year Papers.

After completion of the First Year, students who wish to carry on in the College for their Second Year Course will have to Register their names for the same with the office on the prescribed forms that will be available for the purpose.

#### **EXAMINATIONS**

The College conducts regular tests during the term. These tests are conducted with the view to making sure that the students are ready for their Public Examinations. Report Cards are given out after the tests. The marks obtained in these tests are taken into consideration at the time of Selection for the Public Examination.

#### **ATTENDANCE**

A minimum of 75% attendance is required if a student is to be sent up for the Public Examination. A student having less than the required percentage of attendance is liable to be debarred from these Examinations. Parents are earnestly requested to help us by checking with the College Office from time to time regarding the attendance of the children.

Any student who is absent for Two Weeks without prior permission will have his/ her name removed from the register.

#### **DRESS CODE**

All students must conform to the following dress code requirements:

1. Torn clothing is not allowed.

- 2. No head gear (i.e. hats, caps, skullcaps, scarves, bandanas) are to be worn in college unless approved by the authorities for a special occasion, program or unless there is a medical justification.
- 3. No sunglasses are to be worn unless there is a medical justification.
- 4. Heavy, full length outerwear, such as "dusters and trench coats" are prohibited.
- 5. Dangling chains will not be permitted. This includes chains attached to wallets, footwear and backpacks.
- 6. Visible body piercing jewellery/accessories is prohibited.
- 7. No tattoos.
- 8. Semi-formal / formal footwear is to be worn. Hawaii / Bathroom slippers/House slippers, Flip-flops, Steel Boots are not allowed.
- 9. T-shirts / jackets, etc., when worn, should not have abusive or other objectionable language / pictures printed on them.
- 10. Boys must wear full length trousers. Baggies, low-rise or loose- fit pants are not permitted. All pants shall be worn at the waist. No visible draw strings are allowed on pants. Pockets of pants, skirts must be the standard front pockets.
- 11. Boy's shirts / T-shirts must either be half-sleeved or full sleeved.
- 12. Girls blouses should be sleeved fall well below the waistline, be modestly cut and not transparent.
- 13. Girls may not wear half or mid-length pants.
- 14. Girls' dresses/ skirts must be of length which maintains modesty. Short, skirts skorts and jumpers/ dresses must be no shorter than three inches above the knee. Slits on garments can be no more than 3 inches above the knee.

#### **GENERAL NORMS**

- 1. Dress and general appearance of the students must be in good taste.
- 2. Smoking, drinking, eating / consuming tobacco, talab, khaini- kwai; using of mobile phones or eve-teasing in any form is strictly prohibited in the college and any student indulging in any such activity will be suitably punished. Possession of marker pens/indelible ink is prohibited.
- 3. Communal harmony is to be preserved and fostered by word and deed.
- 4. Students are NOT to change from one stream to another during the academic year. Change of subjects will not be allowed once ONE MONTH OF CLASS has been completed.
- 5. Students wishing to take a transfer certificate during the year have to clear all College dues up to the end of the Academic Year.
- 6. Fees once paid will not be refunded.
- 7. Each student must have College Identity Card which may be purchased from the College Office for Rs.100/-. The Identity Card is to be brought to the College everyday. ONLY ONE DUPLICATE Identity Card may be applied for during the course (two years). This will only be

issued after the student satisfies the College authorities that the original has been lost. The cost of a duplicate Identity Card will be Rs. 100/-.

- 8. Students must read the Notice Board everyday. Ignorance of any notification, such as tests, examinations, special classes etc., will not be accepted as an excuse for not performing a required activity.
- 9. Students shall maintain perfect silence in class rooms and should not loiter in the corridors or speak loudly near other class rooms, library and office premises.
- 10. Disciplinary action will be taken against any student who causes damage to college property or defaces the walls, classrooms and toilets. Desks and benches must not be taken outside the class rooms. Intentional damages will have to be paid in full with a fine.
- 11. Students should abide by the rules, conduct and discipline inside the college. "Ragging" is strictly prohibited. Infractions of good conduct and behavior will lead to suspension/expulsion of the student from the college.
- 12. No Society or Association can be formed by students in the college without the permission of the Principal nor shall any person be invited to address a meeting in the college premises without the prior permission of the Principal.
- 13. No Posters / Banners / Notice / Pamphlets etc will be placed / pasted/ distributed without prior permission of the Principal.

#### LIBRARY

Students are encouraged to use the Library not only for borrowing books but also for doing reference work.

Students have to deposit Rs. 500/- as Caution Money for the Library. The money will be returned at the end of the two year course after deducting fines and charges for loss of books and late returning of books.

Refund of Caution Deposit will only be made on production of the Caution Deposit Receipt.

Caution Deposit will be refunded ONLY on Completion of the Higher Secondary Course or when a student takes his / her transfer certificate.

Each student will be issued a Library Card which will have a record of the books borrowed. These cards will be issued at the beginning of the course on producing the College Identity Card duly signed by the Principal, and the Caution Deposit Receipt.

Students will be allowed a maximum number of FOUR BOOKS at a given time from the Library. A book may be kept by a student for a maximum of 15 days only, after which it will

be returned to the Library. If a student fails to return the books on the appointed day, a fine of Rs. 20 per day per book will be charged.

# **ADMISSION TO HOSTEL**

St. Dominic's College also has Hostel facility. Separate application forms are available for boarders. Those wishing to apply for a hostel seat may collect the forms and submit immediately after admission into the office. At the time of admission, the applicant should be accompanied by his/her parents or the local guardian.
